- j. After discussion, Jake Shy moved and Monty Lee seconded to approve Closed Campus for 9th and 10th graders while allowing 11th and 12th graders the ability to earn Open Campus. Implementation of a Closed Campus for lunch is dependent on the ability to work with the new principal to develop the "earned" campus criteria and a system for staff monitoring of the campus during lunch, and if these variables cannot be adequately determined prior to the start of the new school year, Closed Campus will be deferred until second semester of 2016-17 school year."
